


ENTERING PATIENT SCORES IN THE CLINIC


The patient needs to have had a record created and either a protocol, or a manual score sent out before they can complete their scores in the clinic. As soon as the score has been sent to the web service, an ID and password is created for each surgery. The patient will need these to be able to log into the web server and fill in their scores. You may need to exit and come back into the history screen after sending the score to be able to see the ID and password.

You should bookmark this on your iPad or computer where it is easy for patients to click on.

- 1) Search for the patient and surgery record you want, double click on the surgery the scores are for. At the top of the screen you will see the ID and password. You can write this down for the patient, or click on the print icon and the details will be printed out. These stay the same for all scores, at all time points for this record.

Once you have logged in you will see a list of surveys and questionnaires for you to complete. If you are unsure about how to answer a question, please give the best answer you can, even if you can't do some of the activities the questions may refer to. Some surveys have specific instructions, please read them carefully.

After you have finished please click on **SUBMIT**. If you miss any questions you will be prompted by a message telling you this and the question you missed will be highlighted by an orange dotted line.

Please do not select the **Save and Send Later** option at the bottom of the screen as we would like you to complete all the questions while you are here.

Some surveys might be displayed twice, if this is so one will be asking you how you were **BEFORE** your injury and the other will be asking how you are **CURRENTLY**. It will tell you which one it is for at the top of the screen.

If you have any difficulties please ask one of the staff for assistance.


